“Salvation is Found in No One Else”
Acts 4:1-13

In our culture, it seems arrogant for someone to claim that their way is the only right way. When might such a claim not be considered arrogant?

What does “salvation”, being “saved” in verse 12 mean, and how does it relate to being healed in verse 10?

Besides Jesus and other religious figures, what do people look to for complete wholeness, well-being, salvation?

In verses 9-11, Peter alludes to three different reasons for his claim in verse 12 of Jesus’ uniqueness for salvation.

- What are these, and how might you develop them further?

In chapter 4:8-12, Peter gives essentially the same message to the religious authorities as he gave the crowd in chapter 3:12-25, but he receives very different responses compared to the crowds’ response in chapter 4:4 with that of the leaders in chapter 4:16-18.

- In what ways is your response to the message of salvation in Jesus more like that of the enthusiastic crowd?
- The upset leaders?
