“Encourage One Another”

Hebrews 10:19-25

The writer links “encourage one another” with “meeting together,” but, unlike in the ancient world, today there are many ways to interact with people without being in the same place physically.

- How can you encourage someone without being physically present with them?
- To what extent do you think it is still important to be “meeting together” in order to encourage and be encouraged by someone?

How do the commands of verses 22 and 23 relate to the command to “encourage one another,” and how are all these commands related to verses 19-21?

- How is the encouragement the writer calls us to like, and how is it different from, the encouragement you can receive in a secular setting?

The twice repeated “let us consider” suggests intentional, concentrated thought. With a particular person in mind whom God has placed in your life, “consider” how you might encourage them in the next week.
